Policy

Graduates of Canadian medical schools

Graduates of Canadian medical schools are required to have attained a pass in the Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination (MCCQE) Part I.

Graduates of non-Canadian medical schools

Successful completion of one of the following is required for graduates of non-Canadian medical schools:

- Medical Council of Canada (MCC) Evaluating Examination (MCCEE) or the MCC Qualifying Examination Part I; or
- United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) Steps 1, 2 and 3; or
- National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME) Parts I, II and III; or
- Federation Licensing Examination (Flex) Components 1 and 2; or
- Comprehensive Osteopathic Medical Licensing Examination (COMLEX) Levels 1, 2 and 3.
