## **Supervision Levels for Defined Licensees**

## **Background**

Under the *Medical Act* (2011) and Medical Practitioners Regulations, physicians granted a Defined licence (DL) under the Conditional Register are required to have a sponsor and supervisor for the duration of that licence. Supervision is administered according to the College's four-level supervision framework and *General Guidelines for College-Directed Clinical Supervision*.

## **Policy**

- 1. Defined licensees will normally be subject to a minimum of 24 months of **Standard Level** Supervision.
- 2. Supervision under the College's previous framework (including 1, 3, 6, 9 and 12 month practice reports over the first year of practice) will be considered equivalent to 12 months of Standard Level supervision.
- 3. **Low Level Supervision** may be permitted in the following circumstances:
  - a. 24 months of Standard Level supervision has been completed in a satisfactory manner, including all required supervision reports and activities; **OR**
  - b. The physician has been continuously licensed and practising in Nova Scotia from prior to January 1<sup>st</sup> 2015. For this purpose, continuous licensure is defined as cumulative gaps being fewer than 90 days in total.

AND

- c. The Defined licensed physician's Sponsor and the College agree that no outstanding concerns exist preventing Low Level supervision.
- 4. Notwithstanding the above, supervision may be imposed **at any level** in any of the following circumstances:
  - a. As an interim sanction / condition imposed by an Investigations Committee.
  - b. As imposed by or agreed to in the resolution of an Investigations / Disciplinary matter.
  - c. As ordered by the Registration Committee in response to a concern regarding competence, capacity or character to practice.
  - d. As agreed to by the College and the DL physician's Sponsor, with a written explanation to the Defined licensed physician.
- 5. Supervision level may be appealed as a licensing condition under the provisions of the *Medical Act* and Medical Practitioners Regulations.
- 6. Supervision imposed at the request of or with the agreement of the Defined licensed Physician's Sponsor will be considered a requirement of sponsorship and therefore not subject to appeal.

Defined licensed physicians continuously licensed for more than 60 months may, in appropriate circumstances, be permitted to practise with <u>Sponsor-only oversight</u>.
