ELIGIBILITY

You are eligible to serve on Council if you:

- Are a member in good standing; and you
- Practise medicine in Electoral District 3 effective February 25, 2022 OR you are not currently practising medicine but you live in Electoral District 3 effective February 25, 2022; and you
- Do not sit on a Board or represent a health organization whose mission may conflict with that of the College. This includes but is not limited to: Doctors Nova Scotia, Canadian Medical Association, and the Canadian Medical Protective Association.

COMMITMENT

Term Length	The term for an elected member of Council is three years, starting at the end of May of the election year.
Participation	Elected members serve on Council and on at least one committee of Council.
Meeting Schedule	<p>All meetings are held during business hours and occasionally extend into the late afternoon.</p> <p>Council meets 4 times per year, typically on a Friday for half a day. Council meetings are preceded by a 1.5 hour meeting late in the day, a few days before the full Council meeting.</p> <p>Committee meeting frequency varies.</p>
Time	<p>The time commitment to serve on Council is approximately 20 hours of meeting time per year, plus preparation time.</p> <p>The time commitment to serve on a committee could range from 10 to 50 meeting hours per year, plus preparation time.</p>
Preparation	Council and committee members receive a package of information two weeks before a meeting to prepare them to discuss the issues on the agenda. The time needed to prepare for meetings can range from one to several hours, depending on the committee and the physician's familiarity with the subject matter.

COMPENSATION

Council and committee members are paid an hourly fee for time spent in meetings. They are also reimbursed for travel and accommodation expenses incurred while on College business.

REQUIREMENTS AND DUTIES

Requirements

- Knowledge of and interest in professional regulation and working knowledge of the Medical Act
- Understanding of the statutory, fiduciary and ethical responsibilities of the College
- Willingness to work as an effective and respectful Council and Committee member
- Commitment to the work of the College (a time commitment of 14 hours per month, including Council preparation, meeting and committee meeting time)
- Understanding of the services provided by the College and publicly supporting them
- Computer skills to keep pace with the College's commitment to security and a paper free workplace

Duties

- Govern the College in accordance with the Medical Act and consistent with the broad policies developed by the Council
- Serve on at least one committee and actively participate (with the exception of the Residents' Position on Council)
- Prepare for, attend and participate in the discussions and the deliberations of the Council
- Recognize and be prepared to identify a conflict of interest
- Be accountable to the membership for the services provided
- Abide by and support majority decisions of Council
- Attest to the public accountability of Council process
